NEW BUSINESS:

A. Battle Ground School District Impact Fee Presentation- Mary Beth Lynn

Mary Beth passed out a power point presentation on the school districts Capital Facilities Plan and proposed Impact Fess needed, she reviewed this information with the Mayor, Council and others present at the meeting. She went over the dynamics of how the fees are structured and the needs of the school district based on projected populations/ new construction. She noted that Yacolt does not have a lot of new construction currently. She requested that the council consider the proposal for the increase in School Impact Fees. She noted that Yacolt Primary is the largest elementary school in WA; with a population of approx. 840 students. Questions on why the school district is not addressing the issue where directed to Mary

Beth , who responded with there is a FIT team task force was working on those issues and taking all of the needs of the district in consideration. There is a probability for a Bond in February. School Impact fees are assessed on new construction and does not pay for the current needs of existing schools. The school district is delaying the approval of impact fees until fall with collection in June of 2016. Mayor advised that the council would hold a public hearing during the first meeting in August, Mary Beth volunteered to return to answer any questions.
