Pet license - low income assistance

Clark County and the city of Vancouver have a program to assist low income households and disabled people with the annual cost of pet licensing.

Program Criteria

Pets identified on the low income assistance application must be spayed or neutered. Only one dog and one cat per household may participate in the program.

Low-income households are defined as those where the family's adjusted household income is at or below 50 percent of median, adjusted for household size, as found in the current HUD Income Limits for Clark County.

Proof of income may include copies of the following items from each wage earner in the household:

Pay check/stub
Unemployment check
Social Security check
Pension check
Notice of action (DSHS)
1040 IRS form
Other

Disabled person is the head of household with a disability as defined in RCW 74.29.010.

An application may be denied if the applicant or their animals have been the subject of Notices of Violation, Notice of Abatement, criminal citations, impoundments, or multiple warning notices.

The Animal Protection and Control Advisory Board may assist in making determinations for fund distributions.

Application instructions

- 1. Fill in the pet and pet owner information.
- 2. Attach proof of current rabies vaccination if available.
- 3. Attach proof of spaying or neutering, if available. If proof is not available you must request a spay/neuter affidavit.
- 4. Attach proof of household income.
- 5. Your application will be reviewed according to program criteria. You may be contacted for clarification of information.
- 6. You will receive a written response to your application.
