What if I can't afford a license?

Spay or neuter reduced rate. If your pet has been spayed or neutered, you qualify for a reduced license fee.

A rabies vaccination certificate usually shows that your pet is spayed or neutered. Animal Control will also accept a notarized affidavit. Affidavits are available at the Animal Control office and on our Web site.

Assistance program. A Pet License Assistance program is available for households with limited incomes. Please visit our Web site for qualifications and an application.

Senior discount. Individuals older than 65 receive 50 percent off license fees for one spayed or neutered dog and cat per household.


