An ordinance fixing the time for holding meetings of the City Council and the place thereof.

Be it ordained by the Council of the town of Yacolt.

From April 15 to Sept 15, 8 o'clock P.M.

## ORDINANCE No 4.

An ordinance relating to the presenting and auditing of claims against the town of Yacolt.

Be it ordained by the Council of the town of Yacolt.

Section 1. All claims against the town of Yacolt shall be presented to the Council at the regular meeting thereof by the town clerk; and such claims, except for the amounts due upon contracts in writing, executed under the direction of the town council, shall also be certified to be correct by the officer under whose direction the claim was contracted.

Section 2. All claims against the town for damages shall also be accompanied by the affidavit of the claimant, stating particularly the nature of the damages sustained; and in case of claims for personal injuries, shall state the time and place, when and where such injuries were sustained and the name of the attending physician, if any.

Section 3. All claims before being paid shall be audited by the committee of the town council designated by its rules as the committees on accounts and current expenses, which are hereby constituted a board of auditors, provided,

that the town council shall not be bound by the allowance or disallowance of any claim by said committee; and provided further, that the town council may in its discretion refer any claim to any other committee of the council to be audited.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## ORDINANCE No 5.

To regulate and license the sale and disposal of spirituous, fermented and all other intoxicating liquors within the corporate limits of the town of Yacolt, and to prohibit such sale without license and provide a penalty therefor.

Be it ordained by the Council of the town of Yacolt:

Section 1. No person or persons shall in person or by another, sell or dispose of any spirituous, fermented malt, or other intoxicating liquors within the corporate limits of Yacolt, either on his own account, or on account of another person or firm, without having first obtained a license therefor in the manner hereinafter provided.

Nor shall any such liquors be sold or disposed of within said limits under any license issued in pursuance of this ordinance, except for and on account of the holder of such license.

Section 2. Licenses granted under this ordinance shall designate the building or place of business in which liquors are to be sold or disposed of, and no license shall authorize sales of liquors in more than one building or one place of business at the same time, and no such license shall be transferred from

## **ORDINANCE #4**

### **AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE PRESENTING AND AUDITING OF CLAIMS AGAINST THE TOWN OF YACOLT.**

Be it ordained by the Council of the town of Yacolt:

Section 1: All claims against the town of Yacolt shall be presented to the Council at the regular meeting thereof by the town clerk; and such claims, except for the amounts due upon contracts in writing, executed under the direction of the town council, shall also be certified to be correct by the officer under whose direction the claim was contracted.

Section 2: All claims against the town for damages shall also be accompanied by the affidavit of the claimant, stating particularly the nature of the damages sustained; and in case of claims for personal injuries, shall state the time and place, when and where such injuries were sustained and the name of the attending physician, if any.

Section 3: All claims before being paid shall be audited by the committee of the town council designated by its rules as the committees on accounts and current expenses, which are hereby constituted a board of auditors; provided, that the town council shall not be bound by the allowance or disallowance of any claim by said committee; and provided further, that the town council may in its discretion refer any claim to any other committee of the council to be audited.

Section 4: This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.
