ORDINANCE No 5.

To regulate and license the sale and disposal of spirituous, fermented and all other intoxicating liquors within the corporate limits of the town of Yacolt, and to prohibit such sale without license and provide a penalty therefor.

Be it ordained by the Council of the town of Yacolt:

Section 1. No person or persons shall in person or by another, sell or dispose of any spirituous, fermented malt, or other intoxicating liquors within the corporate limits of Yacolt, either on his own account, or on account of another person or firm, without having first obtained a license therefor in the manner hereinafter provided.

Nor shall any such liquors be sold or disposed of within said limits under any license issued in pursuance of this ordinance, except for and on account of the holder of such license.

Section 2. Licenses granted under this ordinance shall designate the building or place of business in which liquors are to be sold or disposed of, and no license shall authorize sales of liquors in more than one building or one place of business at the same time, and no such license shall be transferred from

one place of business to another, or from one person to another without the written consent of the town Council, obtained at a regular or special meeting and entered on the record of the minutes.

Section 3. All licenses issued under this ordinance shall be granted by the town Council and the Mayor of the town of Yacolt, signed by the mayor and attested by the town Clerk and the seal of said town.

~~Section 4. Any person or firm desiring a license for the sale or disposal of any spirituous, fermented or malt, or other intoxicating liquors within the corporate limits of the town of Yacolt, shall present to the town Council at a regular meeting a petition in writing signed by the applicant, and designating the building or place in which the business is to be carried on; the applicant shall at the same time present to the Council a bond in the sum of One Thousand Dollars, conditioned that the applicant shall keep an orderly house and will not sell liquor to minors, which bond must be signed by one or more sureties and approved by the Mayor, and accepted by the Council, and in case a~~

~~license be granted to the applicant he shall, on making payment to the town treasurer of the sum of Six Hundred Dollars be entitled to a license for one Year, unless the same shall sooner be declared forfeited by this Council for a violation of the terms on which it was granted.~~

Section 5. Any person who shall sell or dispose of any spirituous, fermented, malt or other intoxicating liquors within the corporate limits of the town of Yacolt, without having first obtained a license as provided in this ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to penalties provided by the State laws, and may also be prosecuted before the town Justice of the peace and upon conviction shall be fined in any sum not less than (\$20⁰⁰) Twenty Dollars, nor more than (\$100⁰⁰) One Hundred Dollars, for each offense.

Section 6. Any person holding a license issued under this ordinance, who shall keep a disorderly house or sell or dispose of any of the liquors mentioned in this ordinance to any minors, or who shall violate any of the terms on which said license was granted, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction

shall be fined by the town Justice, not less than (\$10⁰⁰) Ten Dollars nor more than (\$50⁰⁰) Fifty Dollars, and said license shall be declared forfeited by the Mayor and common council of said town.

Section 7. Any pharmacist or druggist who shall sell or dispose of any alcohol or any spirituous, fermented, malt or other intoxicating liquors within the corporate limits of the town of Yacolt, for any purpose or in any manner other than as provided in Ballinger's Code of the State of Washington, Sec. 2937, without having first obtained a license therefor, as provided in this ordinance, shall upon conviction in any court having jurisdiction be subject to the same fines and penalties imposed by any law or ordinance upon any other person for selling liquors without a license.

Section 8. Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed so as to prohibit any pharmacist or druggist from disposing, or to make it unlawful for him to sell or dispose of any of the liquors mentioned in Section 2937 of Ballinger's Code of the State of Washington, for the purposes and in the manner specified in said section.

Section 9. No license issued under this ordinance shall authorize the sale, gift or disposal of any

ORDINANCE #5

TO REGULATE AND LICENSE THE SALE AND DISPOSAL OF SPIRITUOUS, FERMENTED AND ALL OTHER INTOXICATING LIQUORS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF YACOLT, AND TO PROHIBIT SUCH SALE WITHOUT LICENSE AND PROVIDE A PENALTY THEREFOR.

Be it ordained by the Council of the town of Yacolt:

Section 1: No person or persons shall in person or by another, sell or dispose of any spirituous, fermented malt, or other intoxicating liquors within the corporate limits of Yacolt, either on his own account, or on account of another person or firm, without having first obtained a license therefor in the manner hereinafter provided. Nor shall any such liquors be sold or disposed of within said limits under any license issued in pursuance of this ordinance, except for and on account of the holder of such license.

Section 2: Licenses granted under this ordinance shall designate the building or place of business in which liquors are to be sold or disposed of, and no license shall authorize sales of liquors in more than one building or one place of business at the same time, and no such license shall be transferred from one place of business to another or from one person to another without the written consent of the town council, obtained at a regular or special meeting and entered on the record of the minutes.

Section 3: All licenses issued under this ordinance shall be granted by the town council and the Mayor of the town of Yacolt, signed by the mayor and attested by the town clerk and the seal of said town.

Section 4: Any person or firm desiring a license for the sale and disposal of any spirituous, fermented, or malt or other intoxicating liquors within the corporate limits of the Town of Yacolt, shall present to the Council at a regular meeting a petition in writing signed by the applicant and designating the building or place in which the business is to be carried on; the applicant shall at the same time present to the council a bond in the sum of One Thousand Dollars conditioned that the applicant shall keep an orderly house and will not sell liquors to minors, which bond must be signed by one or more sureties and approved by the Mayor and accepted by the Council, and in case a license be granted to the applicant, he shall on making payment to the Town Treasurer of the sum of Six Hundred Dollars, be entitled to a license for One Year, unless the same shall sooner be declared forfeited by the Council for a violation of the terms on which it was granted provided, however, that a license may be granted for a less period than one year upon the advance payment of a license fee for as many 365ths of a year as there are days covered by the application.

Section 5: Any person who shall sell or dispose of any spirituous, fermented, malt or other intoxicating liquors within the corporate limits of the town of Yacolt, without having first obtained a license as provided in this ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to penalties provided by the State laws, and may also be prosecuted before the town Justice of the peace and upon conviction shall be fined in any sum not less than (\$20.00) Twenty Dollars, nor more than (\$100.00) One Hundred Dollars for each offense.

Section 6: Any person holding a license issued under this ordinance, who shall keep a disorderly house or sell or dispose of any of the liquors mentioned in this ordinance to any minors, or who shall violate any of the terms on which said license was granted, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction shall be fined by the town Justice, not less than (\$10.00) Ten Dollars nor more than (\$50.00) Fifty Dollars, and said license shall be declared forfeited by the Mayor and common council of said town.

Section 7: Any pharmacist or druggist who shall sell or dispose of any alcohol or any spirituous, fermented malt or other intoxicating liquors within the corporate limits of the town of Yacolt, for any purpose or in any manner other than as provided in Ballinger's Code of the State of Washington, Section 2937, without having first obtained a license therefor, as provided in this ordinance, shall upon conviction in any court having jurisdiction be subject to the same fines and penalties imposed by any law or ordinance upon any other person for selling liquors without a license.

Section 8: Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed so as to prohibit any pharmacist or druggist from disposing, or to make it unlawful for him to sell or dispose of any of the liquors mentioned in Section 2937 of Ballinger's Code of the State of Washington, for the purposes and in the manner specified in said section.

~~Section 9: No license issued under this ordinance shall authorize the sale, gift or disposal of any liquors on Sunday, or while the polls are open on any day of election.~~

Section 10: This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after being signed by the Mayor and published according to law.
