

An Ordinance to establish the width of Sidewalks in the town of Yacolt, Wash.

Be it ordained by the Council of the town of Yacolt:

Section 1. That the width of side walks on all streets in the Town of Yacolt be and the same are hereby established at not less than four feet nor more than eight feet

Section 2. All sidewalks shall be laid of plank not more than 10 inches wide nor less than 6 inches wide, and not less than two inches in thickness, to be securely spiked with not less than 20 penny nails to three stringers not less than 4x4 inches in size

Section 3. All sidewalks shall be set out from all property abutting on the streets a distance of six inches.

An Ordinance prescribing a notice and regulation for town election.

Be it ordained by the Council of the town of Yacolt:

Section 1. It is hereby made the duty of the town Clerk to give two weeks notice of all town elections, such notices to be published by pasting in at least three public places in the town. The notice shall specify the officers to be elected, the place in the several wards for holding the election and the judges appointed to conduct the same in each ward and the time for opening the polls and closing them.

Section 2. The council, previous to the giving of the notice prescribed in Section (1) of this ordinance shall appoint three judges of election, of which two shall act as clerks, in each ward of the city and shall also at the time designate the several places in the town for holding the election.

Section (3) The judges of election shall each receive three dollars per day for ^{their} services, ^{as} such, to be paid by the town.

Section 4 All the elections in the town shall be held in accordance with the general election laws of the state so far as the same or may be applicable.

ORDINANCE #7

AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING A NOTICE AND REGULATION FOR TOWN ELECTION.

Be it ordained by the Council of the town of Yacolt:

Section 1: It is hereby made the duty of the town clerk to give two weeks notice of all town elections, such notices to be published by posting in at least three public places in the town. The notice shall specify the officers to be elected, the place in the several wards for holding the election and the judges appointed to conduct the same in each ward and the time for opening the polls and closing them.

Section 2: The council, previous to the giving of the notice prescribed in Section (1) of this ordinance shall appoint three judges of election, of which two shall act as clerks, in each ward of the city and shall also at the time designate the several places in the town for holding the elections.

Section 3: The judges of election shall each receive three dollars per day for their services as such, to be paid by the town.

Section 4: All the elections in the town shall be held in accordance with the general election laws of the state so far as the same or may be applicable.
