An ordinance fixing the salary of city officials

Be it ordained by the council of the town of Yacolt

Section (1) That the police justice shall receive a salary amounting to 50% of all fines collected by him, and that he shall retain said amount from all fines when he makes his monthly report to the city clerk, turning the remaining 50% over to the city treasurer, taking a receipt therefor

Section (2) The town marshal shall receive a salary of \$60⁰⁰ per month and in no case shall he receive extra pay for performing any duties connected with the police department, nor shall he receive any fee as a witness in cases against or in behalf of the town.

Section (3) The town clerk shall receive a salary of 10⁰⁰ per month

Section (4) The treasurer shall receive a salary as provided by the laws of the State of Washington

Section (5) No other officials shall receive any compensation for their services.

Section (6) This ordinance shall be in effect five days after the publication thereof.

An ordinance governing children under 18 yrs. of age and providing and penalty for the violation thereof.

Be it ordained by the council of the Town of Yacolt.

Section (1) That no person under the age of 18 years shall be permitted to loiter on any of the public streets or parks within the incorporated limits of the town of Yacolt, between the hours of 9 P.M. and 5 A.M., during the months of April, May, June, July, August and September, or between the hours of 8 P.M. and 6 A.M. during the months of October, November, December, January, February and March in any year excepting when accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Section (2) Any child under 18 years of age, who shall violate the provisions of this ordinance, shall upon being arrested and convicted, be fined in any sum not less than one dollar nor more than \$10⁰⁰.

Section (3) In no case shall any officer be permitted to place any child in jail for the violation of this ordinance without first notifying the parent or guardian of such child, of his intention to do so. Provided: That if the child under arrest is not a resident of the Town of Yacolt at the time of such arrest, then the child shall be locked up and given a hearing before the police justice at Ten o'clock on the following day.

~~Section (4) It shall be the duty of any officer after making an arrest for a violation of this ordinance to turn the child over to the police judge at 10 o'clock on the following day and should any parent or guardian fail to deliver a child over to the police judge as directed by the officer, then they shall become guilty of contempt and subject to a fine of not more than \$10.00 or less than \$1.00.~~

An ordinance granting to J. M. Coulter or his assigns the right and privilege to erect poles and suspend electric wires therefrom within the streets and alleys of the town, and over and across the same, for the purpose of conducting electricity for lighting and heating and power purposes, and to own, control and operate the same, and prescribing regulations therefor.

Be it ordained by the Council of the town of Yacolt:

That J. M. Coulter, or his assigns, are hereby granted the privilege to erect poles and suspend electric wires therefrom within the streets and alleys of the town of Yacolt, and over and across the same, for the purpose of conducting electricity for light, heat and power purposes, for the period of 25 years

The poles so used shall be of such length as to suspend wires 30 feet from the ground in the clear, shall be set at a safe depth, or at least five feet, and shall be replaced whenever decayed to an extent as to be dangerous. The wires used in entering and passing from buildings shall be such as will render them ordinarily free from fire, and entering wires shall be protected by proper tubing and cut-offs.

The poles shall be set inside of the sidewalk curb of any street whereon

~~AN ORDINANCE GOVERNING CHILDREN UNDER 18 YEARS OF AGE AND PROVIDING AND PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.~~

~~Be it ordained by the council of the Town of Yacolt:~~

~~Section 1: — That no person under the age of 18 years shall be permitted to loiter on any of the public streets or parks within the incorporated limits of the town of Yacolt, between the hours of 9 P.M. and 5 A.M., during the month of April, May, June, July, August and September, or between the hours of 8 P.M. and 6 A.M. during the months of October, November, December, January, February and March in any year excepting when accompanied by a parent or guardian.~~

~~Section 2: — Any child under 18 years of age, who shall violate the provisions of this ordinance, shall upon being arrested and convicted, be fined in any sum not less than One Dollar nor more than \$10.00~~

~~Section 3: — In no case shall any officer be permitted to place any child in jail for the violation of this ordinance without first notifying the parent or guardian of such child, of his intention to do so. Provided: That if the child under arrest is not a resident of the Town of Yacolt at the time of such arrest, then the child shall be locked up and given a hearing before the police justice at Ten o'clock on the following day.~~

~~Section 4: — It shall be the duty of any officer after making an arrest for a violation of this ordinance to turn the child over to the police judge at 10 o'clock on the following day and should any parent or guardian fail to deliver a child over to the police judge as directed by the officer, then they shall become guilty of contempt and subject to a fine of not more than \$10.00 or less than \$1.00.~~
