An ordinance granting to J. M. Coulter or his assigns the right and privilege to erect poles and suspend electric wires therefrom within the streets and alleys of the town, and over and across the same, for the purpose of conducting electricity for lighting and heating and power purposes, and to own, control and operate the same, and prescribing regulations therefor.

Be it ordained by the Council of the town of Yacolt:

That J. M. Coulter, or his assigns, are hereby granted the privilege to erect poles and suspend electric wires therefrom within the streets and alleys of the town of Yacolt, and over and across the same, for the purpose of conducting electricity for light, heat and power purposes, for the period of 25 years

The poles so used shall be of such length as to suspend wires 30 feet from the ground in the clear, shall be set at a safe depth, or at least five feet, and shall be replaced whenever decayed to an extent as to be dangerous. The wires used in entering and passing from buildings shall be such as will render them ordinarily free from fire, and entering wires shall be protected by proper tubing and cut-offs.

The poles shall be set inside of the sidewalk curb of any street whereon

they are situated, and free from street crossings

The said J. M. Coulter shall furnish free to the town of Yacalt six (6) arc lights of 1200 candle power each, to be situated as the town council shall direct, lights and poles to be at the expense of the said J. M. Coulter, but any change in the location of the said lights after they have been installed shall be at the expense of the town of Yacalt. The said J. M. Coulter shall also furnish free of charge to the town of Yacalt ten (10) incandescent lights of 16 candle power each, for the lighting of the town hall, and shall also furnish two (2) such incandescent lamps in the town jail.

The lights so furnished to the town of Yacalt shall be turned on one-half hour before sunset each day from October 1st to March 1st, of each year and shall be turned off one-half hour before sunrise of each day.

The said J. M. Coulter shall furnish incandescent and arc lights to residents of the Town of Yacalt at a price not above the price in the schedule hereto attached.

To License, Tax, Regulate and Restrain the keeping of Dogs within the town limits.

The Town of Yacolt does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That no male or female dog, owned or kept in charge by any person, residing within the town of Yacolt, shall be permitted to go abroad or run at large in any of the streets, squares, lanes, alleys, or public places within the corporate limits of said town without first being licensed so to do, and having a collar of leather or metal secured about its neck, with the number of the license stamped from metal or engraved on metal, and any male or female dog of over the age of three months found in any street, square, lane, alley or public place in said corporate limits shall be deemed as running at large whether such dog be alone or in charge of some person.

Section 2. The owner or person having in charge any dog permitted to run at large within the town limits, shall, on or before the first day of April, of each year pay to the town Marshall the sum of One Dollar for each and every dog, which shall entitle such owner or

## ORDINANCE #11

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO J. M. COULTER OR HIS ASSIGNS THE RIGHT AND PRIVILEGE TO ERECT POLES AND SUSPEND ELECTRIC WIRES THEREFROM WITHIN THE STREETS AND ALLEYS OF THE TOWN, AND OVER AND ACROSS THE SAME, FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONDUCTING ELECTRICITY FOR LIGHTING AND HEATING AND POWER PURPOSES, AND TO OWN, CONTROL AND OPERATE THE SAME, AND PRESCRIBING REGULATIONS THEREFOR.

Be it ordained by the Council of the town of Yacolt:

That J. M. Coulter, or his assigns, are hereby granted the privilege to erect poles and suspend electric wires therefrom within the streets and alleys of the town of Yacolt, and over and across the same, for the purpose of conducting electricity for light, heat and power purposes, for the period of 25 years.

The poles so used shall be of such length as to suspend wires 30 feet from the ground in the clear, shall be set at a safe depth, or at least five feet, and shall be replaced whenever decayed to an extent as to be dangerous. The wires used in entering and passing from buildings shall be such as will render them ordinarily free from fire, and entering wires shall be protected by pro??? tubing and cut-offs.

The poles shall be set inside of the sidewalk curb of any street whereon they are situated, and free from street crossings.

The said J. M. Coulter shall furnish free to the town of Yacolt six (6) arc lights of 1200 candle power each, to be situated as the town council shall direct, lights and poles to be at the expense of the said J. M. Coulter, but any change in the location of the said lights after they have been installed shall be at the expense of the town of Yacolt. The said J. M.
