

To Define and Prevent Assault upon an officer within the Limits of the town of Yacolt, and to provide Punishment Therefor.

Be it ordained by the Council of the town of Yacolt:-
Section 1. If any person knowingly and wilfully resist or oppose any officer of the town of Yacolt or other person authorized by law in serving or attempting to execute any legal writ, rule, order or process whatsoever, or shall knowingly and wilfully resist any such officer in the discharge of his duties without said writ, rule order or process, he shall be punished by imprisonment in the town jail not exceeding thirty (30) days or be fined in a sum not exceeding One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), or both said fine and imprisonment made at the discretion of the Court

To Define Nuisances, to Provide for the abatement thereof and the Punishment of Those who allow or Maintain Them

The Town Council of the Town of Yacolt do ordain as follows:
Section 1. That no person or persons within the town limits of the Town of Yacolt shall kill or slaughter any animal, the flesh of which is intended to be sold or offered for sale so as to cause any offensive smell or endanger the health or convenience of any citizen, and no person or persons shall keep in any yard, pen, corral or other enclosure any calves, sheep, swine or other animals for sale or to be slaughtered in such manner as to endanger the health or convenience of any citizen for a period longer than three (3) days within the town limits.

Section 2. No person or persons shall leave exposed or cast into any street, yard, lot, land, or other public place within the said town limits the carcass of any horse or other animal.

Section 3. No person or persons shall cast into or leave or keep in any yard, lot or premise or on any street, lane, alley square or public place within the corporate limits of said town any bones putrid, unsound unwholesome refuse meat of any animal, whether

salted or otherwise, or any unsound pork feet, hides or skin of any dead animal or animals, or any unsound or unwholesome substance or the offensive parts of any beaver, calves, sheep, hogs or other animals.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to expose, to sell or to offer to sell, within the corporate limits of the town, any spoiled or tainted meats, fruits or vegetables.

Section 5. It shall be unlawful for the owner or the occupant of any house, store, building or premises within the corporate limits of the said town to which a privy belongs or appertains to and who use and keep the same, to permit the same to be used or kept in such a condition as to cause a noisome or offensive smell and if any such person maintaining such a nuisance shall not abate the same within twenty-four (24) hours after being ordered so to do by the town Marshall, the Marshall shall, upon the person offending being convicted after due trial, proceed to abate such nuisance at the expense of the person so offending to be recovered in an action in the name of the Town of Yacolt, but in case of failure to recover the expense of such abatement shall be paid by the town.

Section 6. No person or persons shall keep or maintain within the corporate limits of the town

any outhouse, barn, stable, cowshed, poultry yard, or manure pile in such a manner as to cause a noisome or offensive smell and no person or persons shall keep or maintain within the corporate limits of the town any pigsty or pig pen.

Section 7. Any person or persons convicted of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed and held guilty of committing a nuisance, and after conviction thereof before the town justice of the peace or other court having jurisdiction, shall be punished by a fine of not more than fifty dollars or by imprisonment in the city jail for a period of not more than thirty days.
