

An ordinance in relation to licenses and punishment for the violation of the terms thereof.

The Town Council of the Town of Ypselit do ordain as follows
 Section 1. That licenses which the Town of Ypselit is authorized to grant, and which are provided for in this ordinance shall be issued by the town Clerk upon the presentation of a receipt from the town treasurer, showing that the license tax imposed by ordinance has been paid.

Section 2 The owner of any stage carriage, coach, hack, dray, cart or wagon or other vehicle which shall be used for the convenience of passengers, packages, goods or freight of any kind within the town limits, for hire, except hand carts and vehicles used by merchants dealers and manufacturers exclusively for the delivery of their wares to their customers and the vehicles of livery stables and hotels, shall pay a quarterly license as follows: to-wit:

All vehicles drawn by one horse, the sum of one dollar (\$1.00) per quarter; all vehicles drawn by two horses or more the sum of two dollars (\$2.00) per quarter for each vehicle so used. The owner

or keeper of such vehicle licensed under the provisions of this ordinance shall provide a metal plate three (3) inches wide and six (6) inches long, upon which shall be printed in conspicuous figures the number of the license issued therefor and said plate shall be affixed to said vehicle licensed in some conspicuous part thereof.

Section 3 - All peddlars and hawkers shall, before entering upon their business, obtain a license by paying to the town treasurer fifteen (\$15) dollars per month or three (3) dollars per day. Any person who offers goods of any kind for sale by outcry on the streets, alleys or public squares or shall conduct business from a stand or any vehicle anywhere in the town limits, shall be deemed a hawker; and all persons except those peddling newspapers, Bibles and religious tracts, who go from house to house or from place to place in the town selling at retail any goods, wares, merchandise, books, pictures, maps, or any other commodity, shall be regarded as peddlars under this ordinance; provided, however, this section shall not apply to farmers or other persons peddling the products of their own farms, gardens or milk ranches.

Section 4. Any person wishing to exhibit any circus or menagerie shall pay into the town treasury the sum of twelve (\$12⁰⁰) for each and every exhibition.

Section 5. Theatres, minstrels, concert troops, singers, jugglers, sleight of hand performers, lecturers, elocutionists, readers, or any other show, musical entertainment or exhibitions of any kind to which an admission fee is charged in any manner collectible shall pay two (\$2⁰⁰) dollars per day or six dollars per week while exhibiting, performing or holding forth in said town, provided, however, this ordinance shall not apply to church fairs, societies, concerts or other entertainment gotten up by the citizens of Yacolt for benevolent purposes.

Section 6. Skating rinks shall pay a license of five dollars (\$5⁰⁰) per quarter or one dollar (\$1⁰⁰) per day for a less period. Revolving swings or merry-go-rounds shall pay a license of twenty dollars (\$20⁰⁰) per week or five dollars (\$5⁰⁰) per day for a less period. Cane, knife or doll racks, Punch and Judy or other entertainment of a similar character shall pay a license of three dollars (\$3⁰⁰) per day.

Section 7. It shall be the duty of the town marshal to demand

payment of all licenses herein enumerated and provided for, and whenever it shall come to his knowledge of this ordinance being violated within the town limits, to forthwith make complaint in writing to the town justice of the peace.

Section 8. If any person or persons exercise or carry on any trade, profession, or do any act for which a license is required by this ordinance, without taking such license as is in that behalf required by this ordinance, he, she, or they shall, upon conviction thereof, before the town justice of the peace, for each and every such offense, besides being liable for the payment of the amount of the license tax, be subjected to imprisonment in the town jail for a term not exceeding ten (10) days or a fine not exceeding fifty dollars (\$50⁰⁰) or both, at the discretion of the court.
