

An ordinance to provide for the calling of a special election to be held in the town of Yacolt, Clarke County, Washington on the 14th day of September, 1910 for the purpose of voting upon certain propositions submitted to the qualified voters of that town by certain ordinances thereof.

Be it ordained by the Council of the town of Yacolt:

Section 1- That in pursuance of the laws of the State of Washington governing towns of the 4th class, there is hereby called called a special election to be held on the 14th day of November, 1910.

Section 2- At said election there shall be submitted to the qualified voters of said town the question of constructing a gravity water system from Big Creek at a point about a mile and a half from said town in Clarke County, Washington, at an estimated cost of ten thousand two hundred and twenty-three dollars, and issuing negotiable bonds of said town in the sum of fifty-eight hundred dollars to partially defray said cost, all as set forth and detailed in Ordinance No 21 of said town approved August 10, 1910

and entitled:

"An ordinance proposing to the voters of the town of Yacolt that the town of Yacolt make, construct, maintain and operate a gravity water system from Big Creek in Clarke County, Washington, specifying and adopting the proposed plans and details of said Big Creek gravity water system and declaring the estimated cost thereof as near as may be; providing for the holding of an election at which said voters may vote for or against said proposition; providing for the acquisition of the lands, water, water rights, easements, privileges and property necessary for the construction and perpetual control and operation of said Big Creek Gravity Water system in case the voters of said town voting at said election shall assent thereto; providing for the payment therefor in part by the issuance of the \$5800.00 bonds of said town and in part by the issuance of special warrants in the sum of \$4423.20 payable only out of a fund to be established

for the payment of the same, by setting aside therefor a fixed proportion of or a fixed sum out of the gross revenues derived by said town from the public water system owned and controlled by it until the payment of said sum of \$4423.00 shall be completed.

Section 3. At said Election there shall be submitted to the qualified voters of said town the question of constructing, owning and operating a gravity water system from Big Creek, at a point about one and one-half miles easterly from said town at an estimated cost of \$10223.00, and the adoption or rejection of the plans and details therefor now on file with the town clerk, all as set forth and detailed in Ordinance No 21 of said town, approved August 10th, 1910 and entitled as set forth in Section 2 hereinabove.

Section 4-- At said election there shall ^{also} be submitted to the qualified electors the question of issuing \$800.00 dollars of negotiable bonds of said town payable between fifteen and twenty years after date for the purpose of partially paying for the acquisition and construction of the said gravity water system, ^{wherein} said voters assent to the issuance

of said bonds.
Section 5- The Town Clerk is hereby directed to give notice of such election by publication in the Yacolt Bulletin, a newspaper of general circulation in the town of Yacolt and which is hereby designated and declared to be the official paper of said town of Yacolt, said notice to contain a proper list of the places for holding the election and the names of the judges, inspectors, and clerks appointed to hold the same.

Section 6. The following place is designated for said election and the following named persons are hereby appointed to serve as inspectors, judges and clerks and to conduct said election in the town of Yacolt on said 14th day of September 1910 and they are hereby empowered to act as election officers in the matter of receiving the ballots and making the returns for the election of said town, to wit:

The polling place shall be William Hall.

Ordinance No 23.

An ordinance to prevent
 the injury or obstruction
 of streets in the town
 of Yacolt, Washington, and
 providing a penalty for
 the violation thereof.

Be it ordained by the
 Council of the town of
 Yacolt:

Section 1. That any persons,
 who as principal, ^{agent} or otherwise,
 either by placing matter upon
 the surface or by displacing
 the soil, shall obstruct in any
 way or manner the public
 streets of the town of Yacolt,
 Washington in such a manner
 as to prevent or hinder the
 enjoyment thereof for the purposes
 for which they were designed or
 in such a manner as to tend
 to obscure the exclusive right
 of said town to the same for
 public purposes, without first
 obtaining permission from
 the street committee to do so,
 shall be deemed guilty of a
 breach of ordinance, and upon
 conviction thereof before the
 town justice of the peace may
 be fined in any sum not to
 exceed One Hundred dollars
 and costs of prosecution
