

## Ordinance No. 25

An ordinance to prevent the stopping of railroad cars upon street crossings in the town of Yacolt, Washington, and providing a penalty for the violation thereof.

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Yacolt: Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or Corporation to leave standing upon any street in the town of Yacolt, where such street crosses any railroad track, any railroad coach or railroad car of any description; provided, however, that during the switching of such railway coaches or cars, such coaches or cars may remain standing on such street for a period of not more than (5) five minutes at any one time.

Section 2. If any person, firm or corporation shall upon conviction before the police Justice for every such offense be subjected to imprisonment in the town jail for a term not exceeding 10 (Ten) days or a fine not exceeding (100) One Hundred dollars or both at the discretion of the court.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its

passage by the council, approval by the mayor and publication according to law.
