Ordinance No. 37.

An ordinance providing for the improvement of West Railroad Street in the town of Yacolt, Clarke County, Washington, for grading, said West Railroad Street from the South line of Yacolt Road Street south to the North line of Cushman Street and providing for a special assessment therefor on the property specially benefited thereby.

Be it Ordained by the Council of the Town of Yacolt, Washington:

Section I That there be and is hereby established an improvement District within the limits of the town of Yacolt, Clarke County, Washington to be called Local Improvement District No. 3. which shall be bounded by the following mentioned lines and shall embrace all the property included in the following description, to-wit:

Beginning at a point where the South line of Yacolt Road Street intersects the east line of West Railroad

Street in the town of Yacolt thence southeasterly along the east line of said West Railroad Street to the intersection of the said east line of said West Railroad Street with the North Line of Cushman Street; thence westerly to a point 130 ft. easterly from the southeast corner of the original town of Yacolt on a line parallel with the east line of West Railroad Street to a point 130 ft. west from the ^{north east corner of the} original town of Yacolt, said point being on the south line of Yacolt Road Street thence easterly to the point of beginning.

Section II Said West Railroad Street shall be improved by grading of the same in accordance with plans and specifications therefor now on file in the office of the Town Clerk of said Town of Yacolt, Washington.

Section III Such improvement shall be made and the cost and expense thereof shall be taxed and assessed upon all of the

Property in said improvement district, which cost shall be assessed in accordance with the number of feet of such lots and lands fronting thereon and included within said improvement District and in proportion to the benefits derived from such improvements and said cost of improvements shall include all expenses of surveying, advertising, superintendents, etc.

Section IV This ordinance shall be in force within five days from and after its passage by the council approval by the mayor and publication according to law.
