## Ordinance No. 70.

An Ordinance approving and confirming the Assessment Roll of Property in Local Improvement District No. 5 of the town of Yacolt, Wash. for the payment of the improvement of Yacolt Road Street, Hubbard Street and Jones Street east of the Northern Pacific Rail-road Company's right of way and providing for the payment of said assessment.

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Yacolt, Washington

T.

That heretofore the Town Council passed an ordinance for the improvement of Yacolt Road Street, Hubbard Street and Jones Street east of the Northern Pacific Rail-road Company's right of way in the said town of Yacolt within certain limits in said ordinance set forth, and creating Local Improvement District No. 5 the property within the said district to bear the cost of the said improvement. That thereafter on the 7th day of August 1922 the town Engineer as provided by Law and Ordinance of the Town of Yacolt, Washington filed with the Town Clerk, his assessment roll showing the amount of the costs of the said improvement to be borne by each lot tract or parcel of land within the said improvement district. That thereafter the Town Council, by motion, set the 18th. day of September 1922 at the hour of 8 o'clock P. M. as the date for hearing on the said

roll and directed the Town Clerk to give notice of the said hearing in the manner provided by law, and the said notice was given by the Town Clerk by publication in the official town newspaper (Vancouver Columbian) for five consecutive issues and at the same time the Town Council sat for the purpose of hearing objections to the said assessment roll if there were any. That no objections were presented to the said assessment roll either in writing or otherwise.

## II

That the Assessment Roll prepared by the City Engineer showing the detailed assessment and the amount of the costs of the improvement of Macalt Road Street, Huttard Street and Jones Street east of the Northern Pacific Rail-road Company's right of way to be borne by each lot, tract or parcel of land or other property in Improvement District No. 5, and filed with the Town Clerk on the 7th day of August 1922 is hereby approved and confirmed and an assessment levied against the lots, tracts or parcels of land in said Improvement District No. 5 in all respects according to the assessment roll.

## III

That the assessment levied for the improvement of the said streets is levied and assessed under what is known as "The Immediate Payment Plan" and the said assessment and the whole thereof is shown on the said assessment roll is now payable and shall be delinquent from

from and after a date thirty (30) days after the publication of this ordinance and any assessment not fully paid within the said time will draw interest at the rate of seven percent (7%) per annum.

## IV

The Town Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to give notice of said and proceed to collect the same in manner provided by law.

## V

This Ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage and five (5) days after its publication as provided by law.
