Ordinance No. 80.

An Ordinance relating to the regulation and management of the water works of the Town of Yacolt, Washington, repealing Section 31 of Ordinance No. 31, and amending Section 30 of Ordinance No. 67 of said Town of Yacolt, Washington.

Be it Ordained by the Town Council of Yacolt:

Section I

That Section 31 of Ordinance No. 31, entitled: "An ordinance to regulate the management of the water works of the Town of Yacolt, specify the prices to be charged, design to the collector of water rents and the proper committee of the Council to handle the business and other particulars regarding the government of the water system of Yacolt, Washington" be and the same is hereby repealed.

Section II

That Section 30 of Ordinance No. 67, entitled: "An Ordinance amending Section 30 of Ordinance No. 31" be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 30. The following rates are prescribed as the monthly water rates of the Town of Yacolt, said rates payable in advance within the first ten days of each month:

Store, Dry Goods & Lumberies	\$0.50
Store, Drug	.50
Hotel	1.25
Barber Shop	.50
Restaurant	.50
Office Building	.50
Office and Bank	.50
Blacksmith & Garage	.50
School	.50
Church	No charge

Theaters & Public Buildings	\$0.50
Billiard Rooms & Bowling Alleys	.50
Residences	.50
Meat Market	.50
Private barns, two head of stock	.50
Each extra two head or less	\$.25 additional
