## Ordinance #94.

An Ordinance vacating a portion of Ankeny Street in the Town of Yacolt, Washington, and providing for the restoration thereof to the owners of the abutting property.

Be It Ordained By The Town Council of The Town of Yacolt, Washington:

Section 1: That Whereas, heretofore, certain property owners in the Town of Yacolt, Washington, filed with the town clerk their petition asking for the vacation of Ankeny Street therein. And Whereas, the Council, by proper resolution, set the date of May 18, 1942, at 8:00 P.M. for the hearing of said petition, and Whereas, it appears that proper notice was given by posting as provided by law:

That Ankeny Street as the same lies between Blocks numbered Three and Four (3 and 4) of the Second Addition to Yacolt and extending from the North line of Jones Street to the South line of Cushman Street in the said Town of Yacolt, be, and the same is hereby vacated and all the rights of the Town of Yacolt therein, are hereby granted and ceded to the owners of the abutting property, abutting on the said vacated portion of Ankeny Street as provided by law.

Section 2: That this Ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage and five days after the posting thereof as provided by law.

## Ordinance # 95.

An ordinance prohibiting out-of-door fires within the limits of the town of Yacolt, without first having obtained a permit therefor, from the fire chief of the town of Yacolt, and declaring it unlawful to leave a fire unattended, and providing a penalty for violation of any provision of this ordinance and repealing any ordinance or parts of an ordinance in conflict with this ordinance.

Be it ordained, by the Council of the Town of Yacolt, Wash.,

Section I: No person shall set fire to, or burn any slashings, chippings, wood land or brush land, nor burn any rubbish, papers or other inflammable materials, out-of-doors within the limits of the town of Yacolt without first obtaining a permit to do so from the Chief of the Fire Department of said Town of Yacolt.

Sec. II: No such fire shall be kindled within twenty-five (25) feet of any combustible wall, fence or structure and in all cases the person to whom any permit is issued in conformity with the provisions of this section, shall, from the time it is kindled until it is extinguished, have the fire continuously under the care and direction of a competent person who shall take proper precautions to prevent the spread of such a fire to adjacent property or material and to keep or maintain the same under full control.

Sec. III: No person shall deposit ashes in any box or other receptacle of inflammable material.
