

Ordinance No 108

Repealed by Ord # 155 April 22, 1968

An Ordinance to amend Section 2 of Ordinance No. 86, "entitled," An Ordinance to license, tax, regulate and restrain the keeping of dogs within the town limits of Yacolt and providing penalties for the violation thereof.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Town of Yacolt, Washington, as follows -

Section I

The owner or person having in charge any dog permitted to run at large within the town limits shall, on or before the first day of April, of each year, pay to the Town Marshal the sum of \$2.00 for each and every dog, which shall entitle such owner or person having in charge such dog or dogs to a license in which shall be designated the owner's name and number of the license which shall correspond with that worn by the dog.

Section II

This Ordinance shall become effective 30 days after posting as according to law.

An Ordinance to repeal Ordinance No 100 entitled, "An Ordinance amending Section I of Ordinance No. 98 entitled "An Ordinance repealing Section 2 of Ordinance No. 89 entitled "An Ordinance repealing Section 2 of Ordinance No. 80 and amending Section 30 of Ordinance No. 67 entitled," An Ordinance to regulate the management of the Water Works of the Town of Yacolt, Washington, specify the prices to be charged, designate the collection of the water rents and the proper Committee of the Council to handle the business and other particulars regarding the Government of the Water system of Yacolt, Washington -

An Ordinance relating to the Fire Department and public safety declaring an emergency and appropriating money by reason thereof.

Therefore be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Asacolt as follows -

Section I

Due to unforeseen severe weather and the freezing of fire hydrants and accumulation of snow which had to be removed in order to make access to the hose carts, the fund budgeted for 1950 was not adequate, thus for an emergency is found to exist, and an emergency, is hereby declared to exist

The cost of meeting said emergency is the sum of \$200.00, said \$200.00 for the use of further repair of hydrants, and other expenses which may come up before the next budget year.
