

## Ordinance No. 111

An Ordinance to combine the Office of the Town Clerk with that of the Town Treasurer and to abolish the Office of Town Clerk.

Be it Ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Yacolt as follows,

## Section I

That on and after the date of August 7, 1950 the Office of Town Clerk shall be abolished and combined with that of the Town Treasurer, said Treasurer-Clerk to receive the combined salary of Treasurer and Clerk to the amount of \$66.00 per month.

## Section 2.

This abolition shall become effective on said date of August 7, 1950, but may be terminated by Ordinance at any time suitable to the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Yacolt, Washington.

## Section 3.

This Ordinance shall become effective on its date of passage by the Town Council and posting as according to law.

## Ordinance No. 112-

An Ordinance prohibiting children under the age of 16 (sixteen) years from appearing upon the streets of Yacolt, Washington, after certain hours, unless accompanied by the parents or guardian of the same, and prescribing penalties for the violation thereof.

Be it Ordained by the Council of the Town of Yacolt

## Section I

That it shall be unlawful for any child under the age of 16 (sixteen) years to appear upon the streets of the town of Yacolt, Washington, after certain hours hereinafter prescribed, unless accompanied by a parent or guardian of the same.

## Section II

That the Council of said town shall from time to time by resolution establish the hour after which this ordinance shall be effective; provided, that said hour shall not be earlier than 8:00 o'clock P.M., nor later than 10:00 P.M. - Provided further, that in the absence of such resolution, or in the event that a resolution so made be not repealed, amended, or re-enacted upon the expiration of a period of six months from the making thereof, or sooner, the hour of 10:00 o'clock P.M. shall be deemed, and is hereby established, the hour after which this resolution shall be effective.

## Section III

That it shall be the duty of the marshal to arrest any child under the age of 16 years found upon the streets of the

town of Yacolt in violation thereof, and to forthwith conduct such child to its parent or guardian; provided, however, that upon the arrest for a second offence hereunder, the mayor shall notify and request the prosecuting attorney of Clark County, Washington, to proceed against such child and the parents or guardian thereof, under the laws of the state of Washington pertaining to juvenile delinquents.

#### Section II

That any parent or guardian who shall refuse to keep his or her custody off the streets as hereby required shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$50.00.

#### Section I

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after it shall have been passed by the Council, signed by the mayor, attested by the Clerk, and from and after five days after posting.

#### Ordinance No. 113-

An Ordinance relating to and providing for a license fee or occupational tax upon businesses, occupations, and privileges, defining offenses and providing penalties.

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the town of Yacolt, Washington,

#### Section I

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed an exercise of the power of the Town of Yacolt to license for revenue.

#### Section II

For the purposes of this ordinance the following definitions shall obtain:

The word "person" shall mean any individual, receiver, agent, trustee in bankruptcy, trust, estate, firm, co-partnership, joint venture, club company, joint stock company, business trust, municipal corporation, corporation, association society, or any group of individuals acting as a unit, whether mutual, cooperative, fraternal, non-profit or otherwise.

The term "person engaged in business" shall mean the owner or one primarily beneficially interested in lawful business for profit, and not employee. The use of the pronouns herein have reference to the masculine gender shall be taken to mean and includes also reference to the feminine or neuter gender as the case may be.

#### Section III

There is hereby levied and shall be collected an annual license fee or occupational tax against every person engaged in lawful business in the Town of Yacolt, Washington, in the sum of \$12.00 per annum. The license fees or taxes set forth in this
