

town of Yacolt in violation thereof, and to forthwith conduct such child to its parent or guardian; provided, however, that upon the arrest for a second offence hereunder, the mayor shall notify and request the prosecuting attorney of Clark County, Washington, to proceed against such child and the parents or guardian thereof, under the laws of the state of Washington, pertaining to juvenile delinquents.

Section II

That any parent or guardian who shall refuse to keep his or her custody of the streets as here by required shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$50.00

Ordinance No-113-

An Ordinance relating to and providing for a license fee or occupational tax upon businesses, occupations, and privileges, defining offenses and providing penalties.

Be it Ordained by the Town Council of the town of Yacolt, Washington.

Section I

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed an exercise of the power of the town of Yacolt to license for revenue.

Section II

For the purposes of this Ordinance the following definitions shall obtain:

The word "person" shall mean any individual, receiver, agent, trustee in bankruptcy, trust, estate, firm, copartnership, joint venture, club, company, joint stock company, business trust, municipal corporation, corporation, association, society, or any group of individuals acting as a unit, whether mutual, cooperative, fraternal, non-profit or otherwise.

The term "person engaged in business" shall mean the owner or one primarily beneficially interested in lawful business for profit, and not employees. The use of the pronoun herein have reference to the masculine gender shall be taken to mean and include also reference to the feminine or neuter gender as the case may be.

Section III

There is hereby levied and shall be collected an annual license fee or occupational tax against every person engaged in lawful business in the Town of Yacolt, Washington, in the sum of \$12.00 per annum. The license fees or taxes set forth in this

Ordinance shall be for the calendar year, and each person engaged in business must pay the full license ~~either~~ for the current year or balance thereof during which year or portion thereof he has engaged in business. Every license issued hereunder shall expire on December 31st next following the date of its issue.

Section IV

Every person desiring to engage in a business activity within the Town of Yakolt, shall make application therefor to the Clerk in his office, upon a form to be furnished by the Clerk, in which shall be stated the residence of the applicant, the nature of the business activity or privilege in which he desires to engage, the place where it is proposed to be conducted and the amount of the fees prescribed by this Ordinance, which application shall be tendered to the Clerk. If the Clerk shall find the application in order the applicant shall thereupon pay the prescribed fee or tax to the Treasurer, who shall issue a receipt therefor. The applicant shall then present the application together with the Treasurer's receipt for the fee or tax paid, to the Clerk, who shall thereupon issue the license. Said license shall thereafter be prominently displayed in the permanent place of business of the applicant.

Section V

The license granted in pursuance hereof shall be personal to the licensee and shall not be assignable or transferable except upon payment of a transfer fee of \$1.00 to the Clerk.

Section VI

It shall be the duty of the Clerk to require all persons engaged in business to procure such licenses and pay the fee therefor, and should any person fail to obtain the required license it shall be the duty of the Clerk to enforce collection thereof in the manner in this Ordinance provided and to cause the arrest of such persons failing or refusing to procure such license.

Section VII

It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in or carry on any business activity in the Town without first paying for and procuring a license so to do as above provided.

Section VIII

Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed as interfering with, regulating, or taxing interstate or foreign commerce, nor as regulating or taxing any person in business against whom the right of taxation has already been pre-empted by the State of Washington, nor as giving to any person the right to obstruct the streets, sidewalks, or other public places in the Town.

Section IX

Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to require any farmer to procure a license to sell within the Town the produce of his farm.

Section X

If any person engaged in business shall fail or refuse to pay the license fee for any year as herein provided, such fee or tax may be collected by the City upon by proper legal action brought for the purpose. This remedy is cumulative and not exclusive.

Section ~~III~~ XI

Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$100.00 or by imprisonment for not to exceed thirty (30) days, or both such fine and imprisonment. Each day of continued violation of this Ordinance shall constitute a separate offense hereunder.

Section XII

If any section, paragraph, or portion of this Ordinance shall for any reason be held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, such ruling shall not affect the remaining items, parts, or provisions of this Ordinance.

Section XIII

All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section XIV

Ordinance No. 114

An Ordinance relating to street maintenance, declaring an emergency and appropriating money by reason thereof;
