

RESOLUTION NO. 244

A resolution of the Town Council, Town of Yacolt, Clark County, Washington, providing for the submission to the voters of the Town of Yacolt, at an election to be held therein on September 18, 1984, of a proposition authorizing a levy to be made in 1984 for collection in 1985, of additional taxes upon all of the taxable property within the Town of Yacolt of \$7,445.00 the estimated cost to be approximately \$1.05 per \$1,000.00 assessed valuation in excess of the maximum tax levy specified by law without a vote of the electors for the General Fund of the Town of Yacolt. The proceeds of the levy are to be used for the operation, maintenance and salaries of the Emergency Medical Staff and Equipment for the North Country Ambulance for an estimated time of three (3) years.

WHEREAS, it is certain that the money which will be available in 1985-1987 will be insufficient to pay the cost of the Medical Program and to meet the other General Expenses of the Ambulance and that it is necessary that an additional tax levy of \$7,445.00 be made for the purpose outlined above; and

WHEREAS, the conditions and situations hereinbefore set forth create a need which require holding an election in the Town of Yacolt; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council, Town of Yacolt, Clark County, Washington, as follows:

Section 1: It is hereby found and declared that a need exists requiring the calling of an election, and the County Auditor of Clark County, Ex-Officio supervisor of elections for said County, is hereby requested do find and declare the existance of a need. The said County Auditor is further requested and directed to call and conduct an election in the Town of Yacolt in the manner provided by law, to be held therein on September 18, 1984 between the hours of 7:00 O'Clock A.M. and 8:00 O'Clock P.M. (D.T.) for the purpose of submitting to the electors of the Town of Yacolt, for their approval or rejection, the question whether or not a tax levy shall be make in 1984 for collection in 1985 upon all the taxable property of the Town of Yacolt for the General Fund of the Town of Yacolt of \$7,445.00 (the estimated cost to be approximately \$1.05 per \$1,000.00 assessed valuation) in excess of the maximum tax levy provided by law without a vote of the electors of the Town of Yacolt, the proceeds thereof to be used for the sole purpose of continuing the operation, maintenance and the staff salaries of the North Country Ambulance for an estimated three (3) year period.

Section 2: The "Ballot Title" of the aforesaid proposition shall be as follows:

"PROPOSITION:  
EMERGENCY MEDICAL PROGRAM LEVY"

Shall the Town Council, Town of Yacolt, Clark County, Washington, be authorized to levy a tax of \$ 7,445.00 (the estimated cost to be \$1.05 per \$1,000.00 assessed valuation in excess of the maximum tax levy to be made without a vote of the electors, such levy to be made in 1984 for collection in 1985 upon all the taxable property of the Town of Yacolt, the proceeds thereof to be used for maintenance, operation and staff salaries for the North Country Ambulance for an estimated three (3) year period.

Section 3: the Clerk, Town of Yacolt, is directed to certify to the County Auditor of Clark County, ex-officio supervisor of elections of said county, a copy of this Resolution showing it's adoption by the Town Council, Town of Yacolt, ad least 45 days prior to the date of such election, and to perform such other duties as are necessary or required by law to the end that the ques-  
tion of whether or not said excess tax levy shall be made as herein provided for shall be submitted to the voters of the Town of Yacolt at the aforesaid election.

The foregoing Resolution was adopted at a regular open public meeting of the Town Council, Town of Yacolt, Clark County, Washington, on the 19 day of JUNE, 1984, and the following Town Council members were present and voted therefore:
